AGENZIA NAZIONALE PER I GIOVANI – ANG

Agenzia Nazionale per i Giovani is a government body, supervised by the Presidency of the Council of Ministers and by the European Commission, established by the Italian Parliament with Law no. 15 of 23 February 2007 in implementation of Decision 1719/2006 / EC of the European Parliament and the Council of Europe. It is a public law body pursuant to Article 8 of Legislative Decree 300/1999 endowed with regulatory, organizational, managerial, equity, financial and accounting autonomy.

In 2022, therefore, the Agency celebrates fifteen years of activity. The anniversary will be celebrated with a public event that will take place at the MAXXI Museum in Rome, on the 5th and 6th of May 2022. The occasion will be unique to tell the journey started, looking at ongoing projects and above all future objectives, giving voice to institutional representatives, Agency employees, young beneficiaries.

The National Youth Agency manages the Erasmus+ Youth Programme and European Solidarity Corps in Italy and, through their implementation, it implements the European Union strategy for youth 2019-2027.

The institution operates to involve associations and youth organizations, to promote active citizenship, solidarity, inclusion and social cohesion in young people; promotes knowledge, understanding and cultural integration among young people from different countries; contributes to the development of the quality of support systems for youth activities and to the capacity building of civil society organizations in the youth field; it promotes cooperation in the youth field at local, national and European level.

2022 - THE EUROPEAN YEAR OF YOUTH

2022 has been proclaimed "European Year of Youth".

In fact, as stated by the President of the European Commission, Ursula von der Leyen, during her State of the Union 2021 speech: *"if we want to shape our Union in their image, young people must be able to shape the future of Europe. Our Union must have a soul and a vision in which young people can believe (...). For this reason we will propose that 2022 be the European year of young people: a year dedicated to enhancing young people ..."*.

With the establishment of the European Year of Youth, the European Commission, in collaboration with the European Parliament, Member States, regional and local authorities, stakeholders and young people themselves, aims to achieve the following objectives: to celebrate and support the





new generations most penalized by the pandemic, instilling new hope, strength and confidence in the future, highlighting how the green and digital transition offer new perspectives and opportunities; encourage all young people, especially those with fewer opportunities, from disadvantaged backgrounds or from rural or remote areas, or from vulnerable groups, to become active citizens and actors of positive change; promote the opportunities that EU policies offer to young people to support their personal, social and professional development. The European Year of Youth, in fact, will go hand in hand with the effective implementation of NextGenerationEU as regards the creation of quality jobs and education and training opportunities; draw inspiration from the vision and ideas of young people to continue to strengthen and revitalize the common project of the EU, building on the Conference on the future of Europe.

In this framework of programming and initiatives, the Department for Youth Policies and the Universal Civil Service and the National Youth Agency have set up the Ambassador Network of the European Year, which was officially presented at the launch ceremony of the 'European Year of Youth, which was held on March 23 at the Ara Pacis Museum in Rome.

The Ambassador Network, with the support of the Department and the Agency, will undertake to train, approaching the public policies dedicated to it and deepening the regulatory framework; to tell and share the challenges, initiatives and opportunities offered by the European Union, spread their knowledge in schools and universities, with particular reference to the European Erasmus + Programs: Youth and European Solidarity Corps; to involve a greater number of young people by expanding the network and promoting thematic discussions.

The Ambassador Network is made up of about 40 young people, aged between 18 and 30, representing the whole national territory.

THE NETWORKS OF THE NATIONAL AGENCY FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

ANG INRADIO

ANGinRadio is the first institutional radio network made up of young people under 30.

The path, which was initiated in a soundproofed room inside the premises of the ANG, was revived in 2019 through a work of regeneration of spaces and thanks to the involvement of the staff of Ang.

Following two calls, the first in 2019 and the second in June 2020, 100 local digital local radio stations were born, throughout the Italian territory.

The project was born with the aim of promoting the use of digital tools, enhancing positive models, amplifying the Agency's initiatives related to youth policies, informing and listening to young people.

EUROPEERS ITALY

The Italian National Youth Agency has launched the national network of Europeers, a network



present in various European countries that also reaches Italy, with the aim of involving the largest number of young people who have participated in youth exchanges, experiences of European volunteering, European solidarity projects, structured dialogue at European level and / or other opportunities foreseen within the European Youth Programs, most recently Erasmus + and European Solidarity Corps.

These young people, who have already lived the experience of European programmes, thus become real ambassadors, promoting European opportunities to their peers.

In 2021 the network, following a path of active participation and training, was officially established, drafting the first manifesto of the EuroPeers.

GEN C: GENERAZIONE CHANGEMAKERS

"Gen C: generation changemaker" is the project of the National Youth Agency, promoted and implemented in collaboration with *Ashoka Italia*. Currently underway, the project aims to connect all those young people who daily commit themselves to making positive changes, with the aim of encouraging youth leadership and building a large community of girls and boys who are promoters of social change.
